## GRANTS

### NATIONAL MISSION INSTITUTION PROGRAM GRANTS 2022

*Source of funds: Mission Giving and designated funds (noted)*

**AK Child & Family, Anchorage, Alaska** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Spiritual Life Program, which is part of the residential and holistic care for youth with trauma.

**Alliance Center for Education, Charlotte, North Carolina** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the K-12th grade Out of School Time (OST) year-round program. The program is designed to facilitate the healthy development of 75 participants socially, emotionally and academically. The overall goal of the program is that students graduate from high school on time with a career plan.

*Source of funds: A Brighter Future for Children and Youth*

**Amarillo Wesley Community Center, Amarillo, Texas** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to maintain current staff and preserve much needed programs and projects that serve many low-income, at-risk families and individuals.

**Atlantic Street Center, Seattle, Washington** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Teens as Parents Program (TAPP), which is the only program in southeast Seattle that supports 40-45 parenting and low-income teens of color (ages 11-24) by providing them with parent education, social support, and individual assistance. The free and culturally competent services help youth break out of the cycle of poverty by empowering them with the tools, skills, and resources to become safe and nurturing parents, achieve higher education and degrees, become stably housed and successful providers.

**Bennett College, Greensboro, North Carolina** **\$6,000.00**

Funds to support scholarships.

*Source of funds: Anna E. Nitrauer Fund*

**Bethlehem Center, Jackson, Mississippi** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support Project Readiness, a computer-based multigenerational learning initiative that uses technology to help improve learning and social skills in children and youth. This is a new project approach to help the children to be school ready.

**Bethlehem Centers of Nashville, Nashville, Tennessee** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support a Meals on Wheels Program for elderly North Nashville citizens who are homebound, frail and live below the national Health and Human Services poverty line. The Meals on Wheels Program provides a hot, nutritious and healthy meal every Monday through Friday.

*Source of funds: Betty J. Letzig Fund for Ministries with the Aging (partial)*

**Bethlehem Center, Spartanburg, South Carolina** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support existing programs related to the education of children and financial stability of families, specifically women. The educational program "Students Obtaining

Academic Readiness” (SOAR) provides educational enrichment/academic support, character education, tutoring and homework assistance to students in the community. The Outreach program includes financial stability resources and provides financial literacy and computer skills to low-income families.

**Bethlehem Community Center, Winston-Salem, North Carolina** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support a scholarship program to families by reducing the costs of childcare and eliminating over the market rates which the center can charge parents who receive vouchers from Department of Social Services. Free childcare will be provided to parents who are below the federal poverty level or cannot qualify for federal or local assistance.

*Source of funds: Jessie Rutherford Fund (partial)*

**Bidwell Riverside Center, Des Moines, Iowa** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to be used to support the Distribution Center (food/clothing pantry) and Child Development Center.

**The Big Garden, Omaha, Nebraska** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support educational programming, specifically the Grow Your Own summer program and the Farm to School program in the spring and fall. Both programs serve low-income children and youth in Omaha, Nebraska.

**Camp Aldersgate, Little Rock, Arkansas** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support weekend camps (virtual and on-site), summer medical camps (virtual and on-site), and youth volunteer program and specialty camps.

*Source of funds: The Reverend Julius C. & Mary Heald Harvey Memorial Fund (partial)*

**Community Development for All People, Columbus, Ohio** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to implement the Thrive to 5 Program, which supports healthy pregnancies, first birthdays, and kindergarten readiness among children under 5 years old in the South Side neighborhood.

**Cornerstone Family Ministries, Tampa, Florida** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to continue work at the Rosa Valdez Early Learning Center and Lab School and the Garden Movement Nutrition Outreach Programs.

**Cornerstones of Care, Kansas City, Missouri** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support individualized educational support and wraparound services for older foster youth through the YES! program at The Hangout, a Cornerstones of Care drop-in center located in an urban neighborhood. The Hangout provides older youth preparing to age out of the foster care system with access to essential resources and health care. YES! addresses the criminalization of Black youth disproportionately represented in the foster care system by providing an evidence-based model of support for high school graduation and obtaining a post-secondary education or vocational training.

*Source of funds: A Brighter Future for Children and Youth*

**Crossroads Urban Center, Salt Lake City, Utah** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to build capacity of Crossroads' community organizing project, Powerful Moms Who Care (PMWC). Affordable housing, affordable childcare, and access to transportation, education, and job training were the areas of greatest need and since then, some of the same and new women have met regularly to further explore areas of need, solutions, and

action. As the affordable housing crisis in Salt Lake City has become exacerbated with the COVID-19 pandemic, establishing a Family Supportive Housing unit with supportive services and other safe, affordable housing options has become the group's focus.

**Cunningham Children's Home, Urbana, Illinois** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to promote resiliency in families in Champaign County. Cunningham's staff and expertise will be used to partner with county leaders to strengthen families and caregivers, provide clinical expertise in childhood trauma, and to take action against racial inequities. Cunningham commits to coordinating with community partners, like the Community Coalition in Champaign County, that are considering forming a juvenile justice council that would include mental health and juvenile justice collaborators who wish to look at systems-level changes that would ameliorate the lives of families.

**Dallas Bethlehem Center, Dallas, Texas** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support Dallas Bethlehem Center's community-focused programming in South Dallas (increased food distribution, early Head Start programming, community education and engagement programs, and out of school time (OST) programming (currently under review/development).

*Source of funds: Dallas, Texas Project Fund*

**David & Margaret Youth and Family Services, La Verne, California** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to help assist in leveraging other funding to pay for a staff position of an employment and education specialist that would work with young adults in David & Margaret's COMPASS programs. This position is responsible to develop relationships with businesses to help them see the value in providing working/learning opportunities for transition-age youth (TAY) involved in the program.

**Della Lamb Community Services, Kansas City, Missouri** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to address community housing repair needs. The goal is to help improve the quality of life by preserving housing and/or by making the home safer.

**Dulac Community Center, Dulac, Louisiana** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to help maintain the building and grounds at the center.

*Source of funds: Hilda Dewitt Frazer Trust*

**Dumas Wesley Community Center, Mobile, Alabama** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support DWCC's Sybil Smith Family Village (SSFV), which provides up to 24 months of transitional housing for homeless women and families.

**Emma Norton Services, St. Paul, Minnesota** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support housing and wraparound services for approximately 300 low-income, formerly homeless, single women and children at Emma Norton Services' two supportive housing facilities and scattered-site housing program in the St. Paul metro area.

**Epworth Children and Family Services, St. Louis, Missouri** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to be used to support Epworth's Family Support Network (FSN), providing weekly, home-based, cost-free family counseling for families at risk of child abuse and/or neglect.

**Epworth Village, York, Nebraska** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to assist with year two of Epworth Village's three-year strategic plan's capacity

building initiative to strengthen administrative structure and programming in furtherance of long-term sustainability. Specifically, the grant will help fund a new Chief Development Officer position to enhance Epworth Village's fundraising and fund development capacity to grow programs, resources, and sustainability of the mission.

**The Friendly Center, Toledo, Ohio** **\$10,000.00**

Funds to support the ongoing and expanding number of food-related services offered to persons in the poorest neighborhood of Toledo. These include the food pantry, hot lunch program, government commodities distribution, the collaboration with Food for Thought to provide 250 lunches to impoverished and isolated persons per week, and the Connecting Kids to Meals initiative.

**Good Neighbor Settlement House (GNSH), Brownsville, Texas** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to broaden the marketing and reach of GNSH through various Street Outreach efforts. While these changes occur, we will ensure our clients and the community that GNSH will still focus on its Christian mission to aid the homeless and lower-income population of Brownsville, Texas.

**Gum Moon Residence Hall, San Francisco, California** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to increase our fundraising efforts to individual and corporate funders, upgrade our website and build a stronger social media presence.

**Hattie B. Cooper Community Center, Roxbury, Massachusetts** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to create an environment where every child feels good about coming to school. This is accomplished by designing classrooms that promote engagement in learning and by building positive relationships among children, families, and staff. In our use of the Pyramid Model, classroom staff will work together to ensure that all children understand behavior expectations, receive instruction in social skills, and those who are struggling receive individual support.

**Hawthorn Hill, Des Moines, Iowa** **\$10,000.00**

Funds to support Hawthorn Hill's New Directions Shelter, which provides emergency shelter for homeless families with children. The homeless families served are predominately headed by single mothers.

**Henderson Settlement, Frakes, Kentucky** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to help expand the youth ministries program. The effort is to work effectively with more youth, and this grant will help to support current youth ministry and outreach, and build outreach in art, literacy, and music.

*Source of funds: Doc B. Gilbert Memorial and Ella Knox Keener (partial)*

**Interfaith Community Services (InterServ), St. Joseph, Missouri** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to supplement the food pantry program at InterServ, which serves low-income families struggling to fulfill their nutritional needs. In addition, the funds will allow InterServ to establish a feminine hygiene pantry within the existing program, allowing low-income women and girls to access necessary feminine hygiene products to increase health and wellness.

**Killingsworth, Columbia, South Carolina** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to continue capacity building with Killingsworth's board and staff. This grant



will be used to pay for ongoing organizational development to include marketing and fund development. A strong board and staff will lead to improved programs and successful residents.

**Lessie Bates Davis Neighborhood House, East St. Louis, Illinois** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support the programs and activities offered under the agency's Teen REACH program for children and youth in the community, and the programs at the Seasoned Circle Café.

**MacDonell United Methodist Children's Services, Houma, Louisiana** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support the educational support programs at MacDonell, which are designed to help residents reach their educational and vocational goals.

*Source of funds: Pomeroy Trust (partial)*

**Mary Elizabeth Inn, San Francisco, California** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to subsidize the costs of programs administered by Mary Elizabeth Inn, such as the Meals Program.

*Source of funds: Esther Hall and Francis Depauw Girls' School Funds (partial)*

**McCurdy Ministries Community Center, Española, New Mexico** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support Project Cariño, McCurdy Ministries Community Center's free school and community-based mental health counseling program, which serves 563 McCurdy Charter School and MMCC students and their families. Due to the high rates of drug and alcohol abuse, of incarceration, and poverty in this community, which is 86% Hispanic, free mental health programs to support preschool to 12th-grade students and their families are critical.

*Source of funds: Anna Kent Memorial Fund, Minnie Judd Evans & Anna Kent Memorial Scholarship Fund, and the Florence A. Murray Memorial Fund (partial)*

**Moore Community House, Biloxi, Mississippi** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Women in Construction program, which trains women to enter jobs in advanced manufacturing and construction where they can earn higher wages than those most often earned by women in Mississippi's gender inequitable economy.

**Murphy-Harpst Children's Centers, Cedartown, Georgia** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support current and ongoing priority services, including clinical care and treatment, offered to Georgia children and adolescents suffering from neglect and/or physical, emotional, or sexual abuse and trauma, and as a result, are experiencing a range of complex behavioral and mental health issues.

**Navajo United Methodist Center, Farmington, New Mexico** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support the New Beginnings transitional housing program for women and children who are homeless and survivors of domestic violence.

*Source of funds: Hilda Dewitt Frazer Trust, Ethel Schubert Fund, and Essie M. Ranger Fund*

**Neighborhood Center, Camden, New Jersey** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to provide substantial programming for the teens and young adults at the center. It will allow a talented team of counselors and mentors to lead classes and workshops. It will be used to expose the young women and men to alternative lifestyle choices outside of the streets of Camden by interrupting the school-to-prison pipeline.

**Neighborhood Center of the UMC, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support a project to help students improve reading, math, and critical thinking skills.

**The Neighborhood Center, Utica, New York** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to provide working families living on a low income with scholarships for childcare tuition. As part of the mission, childcare fees are kept below market value and provide working families with safe, quality and literacy-based childcare services resulting in improved outcomes for families and children.

**Neighborhood House of Calexico, Calexico, California** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support programming costs for the Calexico Neighborhood House Shelter for Homeless Women and Children.

**Neighborhood House, Wilmington, Delaware** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Early Learning Center and New Directions Early Head Start that provides high quality early care and education to low-income children from birth through age three. The center serves employed women with children primarily residing in Wilmington – with family incomes generally at or below the federal definition of families living within poverty.

**Neighborhood Services Organization, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to provide safe, healthy homes, dental care and nutrition services to vulnerable Oklahoma City residents. These programs help remove barriers of economic inequality for those who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness in the community.

**New Bethlehem Community Center, Augusta, Georgia** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Senior Citizens Congregant Meal Program, Community Food Pantry, After-School Homework Assistants and Tutoring, Adult Computer Education Program, GED Instructor and Program, Teen Pregnancy Prevention, HIV and Hep C Education and Testing, and the Community Garden and Playground.

**Nome Community Center, Nome, Alaska** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to subsidize vital services to the elders, youth and children of Nome.

*Source of funds: Hilda Dewitt Frazer Trust*

**Northcott Neighborhood House, Milwaukee, Wisconsin** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support Seeding the Future summer and after-school programming, which focuses on creating opportunities for young people from low-income communities to learn about Hydroponics, Sports Education, Information and Communication Technology (ICT) and Financial Literacy.

**North Rampart Community Center, New Orleans, Louisiana** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the After-School Program and Summer Camp. The After-School Program offers homework assistance, reading, swimming (on select days), music (on select days) and recreational activities for all children. The Summer Camp offers reading, art, computer technology, swimming and recreational activities for all children.

*Source of funds: Boylan-Haven-Mather Memorial Funds (partial)*

**Open Door Community House, Columbus, Georgia** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support all program ministries serving women, children, and youth with new or upgraded technology to enhance our capacity to teach, train, and support. Now that the organization is opening back up following COVID, it has become clear that technology can greatly enhance S.T.E.A.M. projects and other educational programming with the children and youth, and increase the ability to provide enhanced curriculum in all adult classes, as well as perform real-time and in-the-field intakes with women experiencing homelessness.

**Partners In Ministry, Laurinburg, North Carolina** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support our Community Education Center will enable Partners In Ministry (PIM) to expand and enhance its programs and services. This expansion will remove barriers that breed poverty and create additional opportunities to invest in youth through education, college/career readiness and job creation, which will lead to better livelihoods for poor communities of color.

**Red Bird Mission, Beverly, Kentucky** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to pay general program expenses necessary to carry out the mission with the families in remote mountain communities.

**Robinson School, San Juan, Puerto Rico** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Scholarship and Financial Aid Program, which provides full scholarships for talented students in need, as well as tuition support for families with multiple children enrolled and/or enrolled families facing economic hardship.

**Ruth M. Smith Center, Sheffield, Pennsylvania** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to provide care to residents and day care children.

**Scott's Run Settlement House, Pursglove, West Virginia** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Food Pantry program, which aims to provide low-income families with a week's worth of nutritious food at no cost to ease their financial burden.

**Shesler Hall, Sioux City, Iowa** **\$13,600.00**

Funds to subsidize operating expenses.

**Southside Community Center, San Marcos, Texas** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to assist low-income families and individuals with transitional homeless shelter utilities or rent costs.

**Susanna Wesley Family Learning Center, Charleston, Missouri** **\$10,000.00**

Funds to empower young women and girls to effect change through a mentoring model focusing on producing equity, inclusion, and justice for communities of color. This will be accomplished by empowering young women to use their voices to advocate for self-defined social justice change at the local, regional, and state level.

**Susanna Wesley House, Baltimore, Maryland** **\$8,500.00**

Funds to support the Susanna Wesley House's effort to provide wraparound case management services for its clients. In addition to services provided through in-house resources (both paid and volunteer), the Susanna Wesley House will refer clients to appropriate professionals through partnerships it is establishing with various service providers throughout the City of Baltimore.

**Susannah Wesley Community Center, Honolulu, Hawaii** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to continue a long-term educational support program called PromotED that works with 4th-7th grade Kalihi students, parents, mentors, and schoolteachers/counselors from late elementary through high school. PromotED works with the entire family offering integrated case management and support services from our truancy prevention to home-based parenting, and youth development programs.

**Tacoma Community House, Tacoma, Washington** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to be used for Immigration Services program support, specifically for one-on-one case management and United States Citizenship and Immigration Services application support.

**Toberman Neighborhood Center, San Pedro, California** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the Center's after-school program (Toberman Academy), specifically Gang Prevention and Intervention, for youth who are expected to go back to the school campus full time in the Fall. At this time, these students need this support as they've been distance learning for over a year and the transition could be difficult for many.

**United Community Centers, Birmingham, Alabama** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to enhance and continue the Healthy Food for the Family programs, providing food for the Food Pantry, purchasing food for the Senior Citizens Nutrition program, and snacks for the after-school program.

**United Community Centers, Fort Worth, Texas** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to support the educational specialists in the Educational Enrichment Program (EEP) and leveled literacy intervention programming. The educational specialists work at least three days per week reviewing lesson plans, coaching instructors and doing expert reading assessments of students. EEP is an affordable, licensed childcare program for low-income families with a focus on literacy using research-based curriculum.

**United Methodist Community House, Grand Rapids, Michigan** **\$15,000.00**

Funds to support the operations of the agency as it begins implementing a transformation plan for greater community impact.

**United Methodist Neighborhood Centers(The Beth),  
Chattanooga, Tennessee** **\$20,000.00**

Funds to increase educational opportunities for students in the Read to Lead (RTL) Academy; adult education through Community Connection initiatives and mentorship opportunities in the Bethlehem Leadership Unit.
