What We Do

United Women in Faith carries out its mission and works to address the challenges impacting women, children, and youth in a variety of ways, all of which center on calling on each person to tap into their God-given potential for compassion, strength, generosity, and creativity.

We equip women to become leaders in the church, their communities, and the world.

United Women in Faith provides unique opportunities for women to learn and build the **leadership skills** they need to create meaningful change in their communities.

We support organizations and individuals, projects, and programs that better the lives of women, children, and youth.

United Women in Faith awards over \$4 million in **grants and scholarships** annually to organizations and individuals around the world, including nearly 90 community-based **National Mission Institutions** in the United States and to **partners in 39 countries** around the world.

We mobilize women to work for a more just, equitable, and peaceful world.

United Women in Faith develops **materials and educational programs** that help women and others to work locally and globally for peace, justice, and a sustainable planet.

The Issues We Address

United Women in Faith works for a more just and equitable society, to protect our natural environment, and to improve the lives of women, children, and youth around the world.

Key issues United Women in Faith seeks to address include promoting racial justice and climate justice, developing leadership opportunities for women, and providing grants for social services such as day care, job training, and food provision for women and families in need through a network of nearly 90 community centers and special agencies known as National Mission Institutions.

Who We Are

The story of United Women in Faith dates back to 1869 when eight Methodist Episcopal women formed the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society to help meet the needs of women, children, and youth in India. Today, that organization is known as United Women in Faith, with hundreds of thousands of members across the United States and partners around the world.

The Purpose of United Women in Faith is to be a community of women whose purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.

The mission of United Women in Faith is to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship, and education so that they can inspire, influence, and impact local and global communities.

The vision of United Women in Faith is a world in which women, children, and youth can thrive and reach their fullest potential.
